BSBC's WILDERNESS PROGRAM...



The Wilderness Program of Big Sky Bible Camp had an awesome, adventurous and amazingly blessed summer in 2020. We are so very thankful for the work



God did in the lives of the leaders and participants, and the protection and safety He provided. All three trips saw great interest and were maxed out with more young people wanting to go than we could take. What a wonderful "problem" to have!

The Trail Camp trip kicked off the backpacking season with two weeks of incredible experiences and extremely hard work.



Our team worked on 1,128 yards of trail, including the clearing of 12 trees, 4 drainages and countless amounts of brush. All of this was done with basic hand tools



and manual cross-cut saws. This was the 26th year that a crew from Big Sky Bible Camp has worked on trail maintenance and construction in the Bob Marshall Wilderness Complex and we look forward to continuing the special tradition and worthwhile endeavor.



The Junior High Boys and Girls trips once again explored the Jewel Basin Hiking Area and experienced some of God's remarkably beautiful wilderness settings.

These 4 night trips are a wonderful introduction to overnight backpacking. The trips are led by exceptionally gifted and experienced leaders that get to pass on their backpacking and wilderness adventuring skills, while at the same time encouraging and guiding the participants in their understanding of, and relationship with, God. The lives of these young people were profoundly impacted. Exploring biblical truths while experiencing back-country adventures uniquely intensifies the learning opportunity. One of the biggest challenges I have as director is conveying what I see take place on a daily basis throughout the summer to those who love and support Big Sky, but are not here to see what the Lord is doing firsthand. I have thought long and hard about how to do this better, but have thus far come up with nothing more than words to describe what takes place each summer. I would invite you to join me as I describe two of the most encouraging times of the week throughout the summer:

1. *Staff Meetings* – Twice a week, a portion of the staff (of course the campers have to always be supervised!) meet together at 7 in the morning to pray, hear from God's Word and share what is going on in their cabin. I continually think that I should record these meetings because this is where



we hear how the Holy Spirit is moving in the hearts of the campers and staff. During one of the meetings this summer, I recall one of the counselors sharing how one of their campers came to know the Lord. This was not simply a hand raising, either, but rather a deep conviction of sin and a desire to know the one who could save them from this sin. Through countless questions and conversations with their counselor throughout the week, this camper came to know Christ as their Savior and we rejoice in that.
